## **Hawaii Votes By Mail**

- Starting with the 2020 Elections, voting in Hawaii

  1. will be by mail ONLY. Registered voters will no longer vote at traditional polling places.
- A registered voter's ballot will be mailed to his / her voter registration address at least 18 days before the Primary Election and Election Days.

Make sure you are registered to vote or you can

- 3. even register to vote online at: https://olvr.hawaii.gov.
- You can also register to vote and cast a ballot at

  Voter Service Centers, which are open 10 days
  prior to Primary Election and Election Days.









## Hawaii Votes By Mail

Complete your ballots once you receive them in the mail and mail them back. No stamps will be needed. Mailed ballots must be received by 7 pm on Primary Election and Election Days.

If you are voting in-person at a Voter Service

6. Center, you may wait in-line even if it is after 7 pm to cast your ballot.
