# Hawaii Votes By Mail

Starting with the 2020 Elections, voting in Hawaii

**1.** will be by mail **ONLY**. Registered voters will no longer vote at traditional polling places.

**2.** A registered voter's ballot will be mailed to his / her voter registration address at least 18 days before the Primary Election and Election Days.

**3.** Make sure you are registered to vote or you can even register to vote online at:  
<https://olvr.hawaii.gov>.

**4.** You can also register to vote and cast a ballot at Voter Service Centers, which are open 10 days prior to Primary Election and Election Days.

**5. Complete your ballots once you receive them in the mail and mail them back. No stamps will be needed. Mailed ballots must be received by 7 pm on Primary Election and Election Days.**

**6. If you are voting in-person at a Voter Service Center, you may wait in-line even if it is after 7 pm to cast your ballot.**
