Donna Edwards - Allows corporate contribution limits and bans	Rep. Marcy Kaptur - Exempts corporations from 1st amendment protections in regards to political money as speech and allows Congress and the states to regulate electoral money for candidates.	Rep. Kurt Schrader - Amendment giving Congress power to regulate campaign contributions for Federal elections.	Sen. Bernie Sanders - Overturn Citizens United by establishing public financing, enacting disclosure, ending corporate personhood, and allowing limits on independent expenditures all at once.
