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## Introduction by New York State Common Cause

Hundreds of thousands of dollars in campaign contributions are being funneled to key state officials, legislators and legislative campaign committees by corporations, law firms and trade groups with major financial stakes in the state's environmental policy.

That's the major conclusion of this joint study by the Citizens' Environmental Coalition and New York State Common Cause. Indeed, our review of campaign contributions has established that these "environmentally involved" groups have given substantial sums to candidates and political parties:

- \* In the past 22 months alone, these groups have given at least \$263,585.

- \* Of that amount, the lion's share has gone to Governor Cuomo. Cuomo has received \$78,880 in the period between January 1, 1989 and October 1, 1990.

- \* Also benefiting from this group's largesse have been the legislative party committees supporting the majority party's candidates in each house. Committees supporting Senate Republican candidates received a total of \$54,000 from this group. The Democratic Assembly Committee received \$30,700.

- \* The chairs of key environmental committees in each house also received contributions from this group. The \$4,650 contributed to Owen Johnson, chairman of the Senate Environmental Conservation Committee, constituted over 10 percent of the total contributions he has received in the past 22 months. Assemblyman Maurice Hinchey, who chairs the Assembly Environmental Conservation Committee, received \$3750 from this group, or about seven percent of the contributions he received in the same period.

This report is far from complete. On the date we completed our research at the State Board of Elections, two candidates - Assemblyman William Hoyt and Senator John Daly - and two committees - the Committee for a Republican Assembly and the New York Republican State Committee - had not yet filed a report for the period between July 15 and October 1.

And we faced other obstacles to fully determine all the contributions made by this group. For example, since

Political Action Committees in New York are not required to use a name that indicates the PAC's connection to a company or group, we are not sure that we have uncovered all the pertinent PAC contributions from this group.

Another major problem is that state law does not require that individuals who give substantial amounts to political candidates identify their place of work and job titles. We lacked the time and resources to cross-check major contributions from individuals against a roster of corporate executives. We urge journalists and interested citizens to pursue this endeavor, particularly for two major companies in New York for whom we could find no contribution history: Eastman Kodak and I.B.M.

This report has not found a smoking gun: no evidence of massive conspiracy by anybody to sabotage the state's environmental policy. But we believe that all citizens should be concerned about the role of money from special interests in the shaping of state's environmental policy. Special interests give to get access. And access to legislators and state officials often plays a crucial role in determining how these key players view environmental problems - and how, and whether, - they fashion solutions for them.

Do average New Yorkers - who breathe the air, drink the water and long to raise their children in a safe world - have the same access?

Common Cause sees only one way to guarantee an environmental policy that truly represents all the people of New York, not just the concerns of the well-heeled few: campaign finance reform that includes sharp limits on contributions to candidates and party committees, public matching funds to candidates, and curbs on what candidates may spend on campaigns.

For it is only when our legislators and state officials are no longer beholden to special interests and their big contributions that they will truly start paying attention to the rest of us.

## Introduction by Citizens' Environmental Coalition

Our report provides citizens with an initial overview of the monetary contributions made by corporations, law firms and Political Action Committees who represent the industrial viewpoint on critical environmental problems in New York State. We investigated companies and law firms who represent the "Burn & Bury" approach versus the environmentally-sound "Reduce & Recycle" approach to the problems created by hazardous, solid and radioactive wastes and pesticides. Their activities include: siting hazardous and solid waste incinerators; creating radioactive, industrial, incinerator ash, and hazardous waste dumps; and the pervasive use of toxic pesticides.

We selected these companies and law firms by surveying dozens of community and environmental leaders working on hazardous waste problems in Citizens' Environmental Coalition's (CEC) 80 member groups, as well as three other statewide groups. Companies involved in radioactive waste issues were provided by Don't Waste New York, the statewide coalition of community and environmental groups opposing the siting of a state "low-level" radioactive waste dump. Incineration companies and law firms representing their interests were provided by members of Work On Waste, NYS, a coalition of environmental and citizen groups who oppose garbage incineration and support recycling programs. Organizations, companies and law firms involved in pesticide use were provided by the statewide New York Coalition for Alternatives to Pesticides.

We do not mean to condemn all of the following companies and law firms, although many of them have caused massive pollution problems in our state. We merely asked key environmental and community leaders working on critical pollution problems who they would be interested in knowing had contributed to key legislative and government leaders.

This report is really a first step in ascertaining how government is influenced by the industry it regulates and legislates on environmental policies. The contributions listed in this report could be only the tip of the iceberg. CEC urges people to take the next important step in this learning process, by obtaining the Board of Directors and Corporate Executives list of a particular company and investigating their campaign contributions. Researching subsidiaries of companies is another important step we were not able to do at this time. We would be happy to assist in such an activity by visiting the Board of Elections to send the complete list of contributions of certain politicians for your review (copying costs need to be reimbursed).

The information we sought was not easily obtainable, due to a number of obstacles as noted earlier by Common Cause. For instance, a number of the Political Action Committees (PAC) operate quite discreetly under names which hide the nature of the source. A classic example of this is the PAC for the

International Paper Company, a company known for its air pollution problems. Their PAC is titled "Voluntary Contributors for a Better Government."

The list of companies, organizations and law firms which were researched is on the next page by issue area. We investigated contributions over the last two years, 1989 and 1990. We hope this report will help you better understand environmental politics in New York State government. If you uncover additional information in your own contribution investigation, please share it with us so we can include it in a possible report next year. Thank You.
