**DECLARATION OF SHANNON L. ROIVAS**

I, Shannon L. Roivas, hereby declare as follows:

- 1) I have personal knowledge of the matters in this declaration and this is what I would testify to if called as a witness in Court.
- 2) I am 31 years old and am otherwise competent to testify.
- 3) I am a resident of Mesa, Arizona, located in Maricopa County. I moved to Arizona in 2019. Prior to that, I resided in Durham County in North Carolina.
- 4) I am a 7<sup>th</sup> year PhD graduate student studying Anthropology and staff at Arizona State University in the School of Human Evolution and Social Change.
- 5) The right to vote is important to me. I'm an American citizen and I believe in this country and in our democracy. The right to vote isn't a trivial issue to be politicized; it's the way we operate our society. I believe that people on both sides of the aisle agree on that.
- 6) I have had to move around a lot because of my work in science as I have worked on growing in my career. I have always been meticulous about changing my documentation in each place I've resided:
  - a.) As a student, I have had to change my address and voter registration multiple times. This is due to the need for affordable housing, especially when I am juggling being a full-time student and having a limited income.
  - b.) During my undergraduate program I lived in North Carolina where I was registered to vote.
  - c.) I updated my voter registration to Arizona when I moved to Arizona for my graduate program in 2019.
  - c.) Being an active voter in Arizona has been important to me because of my long-term status in the state. With my graduate program being so long it was important to me that I was able to participate civically in the community I belong to.
- 7) As a student, I know that it can be difficult to feel like we have proper representation since we are often caught in the cycle of switching homes and finding roommates. As our colleagues graduate and move, we are often faced with the burden of having to relocate in

order to stay afloat. Nonetheless, eligible students deserve to be able to participate in our civic duties.

8) I always make it a priority to update all of my paperwork, including voter registration, to reflect my circumstances. Finding housing as a student is already stressful enough while trying to ensure that my right to civic participation isn't compromised due to relocations.

9) Based on this experience I have significant concerns about the Department of Justice's request for the full, unredacted Arizona voter file. It is not clear to me why they need this information and what processes they are seeking to improve that aren't already addressed in our system. I don't see how releasing this private data will ensure a fairer election and am concerned that an attempt to use the data may in fact lead to a less certain outcome.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct according to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.
