Guidelines for ROVING Poll Monitor Shifts:

- Please coordinate with your volunteer distribution captain to receive yard signs and other materials **prior to election day!**
- **In light of the ongoing threat of COVID-19**, Volunteers should notify us and NOT rover monitor if they are sick (regardless if it is COVID-19 or not). Volunteers are encouraged to engage in social distancing and wear a mask if you choose to exit your vehicle to check on your polling places.
- **If you have an early Rover shift (5AM-9:30AM), place one Election Protection yard sign at each polling place by 6AM before the polls open—and leave them there for the entire day.**
- **If you have a late Rover shift (4:30PM-9:00PM), please retrieve the Election Protection yard sign (if present) at each of your polling places.** please coordinate with your State Lead or a volunteer distributor to return yard signs and car magnets.
- During your shift/s, volunteer nonpartisan rovers drive to each of the polling places in your turf at least once per shift and report either **from inside your vehicle, or from outside the 75 foot electioneering line** on the status of the items you see in the Polling Place Checklist. **Submit a new Polling Place Checklist report every time you arrive at a polling place, even if you visit multiple times.**
- If you see or think you might be seeing signs of voter intimidation or something else that you think should be escalated, **fill out an Incident Report online in addition to the Polling Place Checklist.**
