

# **Common Cause Redistricting Poll – Florida**

#### **Key Takeaways:**

Most Florida voters *oppose* both mid-decade redistricting and drawing district boundaries to give one party an advantage. Most Florida voters *support* both independent redistricting commissions and a boundary-drawing process that puts community interests ahead of political advantage. Voters say that the way voting district boundaries are drawn is important to the overall health of democracy in the United States.

#### **Executive Summary:**

- **1.** 55% of registered Florida voters oppose allowing political parties to change district boundaries mid-decade [Q7]:
  - a. Republican voters: 45% oppose / 36% support
  - b. Democratic voters: 62% oppose / 25% support
  - c. No Party Affiliation voters: 60% oppose / 14% support
- 2. 66% of Florida voters support Congress passing a law prohibiting states from drawing district boundaries to give one party an advantage [Q6-2]:
  - a. Republican voters: 58% support / 31% oppose
  - b. Democratic voters: 74% support / 18% oppose
  - c. No Party Affiliation: 69% support / 19% oppose
- **3.** An overwhelming majority of registered Florida voters (76%) support having an independent commission of citizens draw electoral districts instead of state lawmakers [Q6-1].
- **4.** Over three-in-four Florida voters (76%) support a boundary-drawing process that puts community interests ahead of political advantage [Q6-4].
- **5.** 84% of registered Florida voters say that the way voting district boundaries are drawn is important to the overall health of democracy in the United States [Q2].

- **6.** A plurality of Florida voters (33%) trust a bipartisan independent commission the most to decide how voting district boundaries are drawn [Q3].
- **7.** Nearly two-thirds (64%) of Florida voters say it is bad for the country when one political party controls how voting districts are drawn [Q4].
- **8.** Voters are split on the best approach for drawing voting districts, with a narrow preference for drawing them to ensure fair competition between parties (28%) [Q5].
- **9.** A narrow plurality of Florida voters (41%) support states responding in kind if another state changes its boundaries to give a political party an advantage (i.e. "counterbalancing") [Q8].
- **10.** Half of Florida voters (50%) oppose state lawmakers leaving the state to prevent a vote when they disagree with proposed changes to district boundaries [Q9].

#### Methodology

This poll was conducted by Noble Predictive Insights from August 26-September 2, 2025, and surveyed Florida registered voters via opt-in online panel and text-to-online. In total, we interviewed 499 registered voters. The sample demographics were weighted to accurately reflect the registered voter population by gender, region, age, party registration, race/ethnicity, and education according to recent voter file data and recent Census data. The margin of error was +/- 4.39% for registered voters.
