

Protect U.S. Citizen Voters:

Stop HB 991 & SB 1334

Florida House Bill 991 and Senate Bill 1334 would remove thousands of eligible U.S. citizens from the voter rolls and prevent eligible U.S. citizens from being registered to vote.

WHAT WOULD THESE BILLS DO?

HB991 & SB1134 would require ALL Florida voters to re-verify their citizenship status in order to keep voting in the state of Florida.

All new and existing voters would have their records checked in error-prone government databases. If the database doesn't have the correct documentation on file for you, you have to submit specific documents to prove your citizenship – even if you've been voting for years.

Even worse, if your document – like your birth certificate – has a different name on it, you would ALSO have to submit official proof of your legal name change.

Many Floridians don't have a passport or their original birth certificate – and getting replacements is expensive. The last thing Floridians need is another expense. And they certainly shouldn't have an added expense to exercise their right to vote as Americans.

This impacts all of us by blocking the votes of eligible citizens from being heard in our elections.

We don't know how many people will be blocked from voting because the procedures are being kept in the shadows. But we know who this will impact most:

- ✓ Seniors
- ✓ Students and young people
- ✓ Lower-income families
- ✓ Naturalized citizens
- ✓ Anyone who doesn't have a driver licence or state ID
- ✓ People who have changed their name due to marriage or other reasons

It is already illegal for non-citizens to vote in Florida, and the consequences of doing so are already extremely harsh. That's not what these bills are really about. This is about making voting harder for Floridians so that our elected officials aren't held accountable.
