

Activity Guide: What You Can & Can't Do

What you CAN do

DO share the RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov link widely for people to register online with their personal phone, tablet or computer!

DO let people use your phone, tablet or computer to register to vote online at RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov

DO invite your county Supervisor of Elections to come and do Voter Registration at your community event!

DO provide people with a BLANK voter registration form, tip sheet, and a stamped, addressed envelope for them to mail their application form to the county Supervisor of Elections or the Florida Division of Elections.

DO reserve space at a public library for a community event where people can fill out their voter registration application form and submit it directly to the librarian.

DO give people “rides to registration”. You can bring them to any public library or Supervisor of Elections office.

DO direct your friends to events where the elections office is scheduled to be doing voter registration. Check the social media or website of your county Supervisor of Elections for events.

DO help people get a Florida ID Card so it is easier for them to register and vote! VoteRiders provides free assistance to help people get ID. Call or text their hotline at 866-ID-2-VOTE.

What you CANNOT do

DO NOT collect or handle paper voter registration forms that are partially or fully filled-out. This can put you at risk of fines. Applicants must turn in their forms to the elections office themselves (in person or by mail). Applicants can also turn in their forms at any public library or at one of the government offices that accept voter registration forms.

DO NOT give something to the voter in exchange for registering (ex: no “register to vote, get a slice of pizza”). But you CAN have a party or event to educate potential voters and encourage them to register, as long the food/items are available to all and not only for those who choose to register.

DO NOT allow members or parishoners to leave voter registration applications in your office or inbox. You may want to put up a sign telling people not to do this.

DO NOT encourage people to register if they are not eligible. This can put the individual at risk of legal and criminal penalties.

DO NOT provide advice to people about their eligibility to register or vote. Refer them to the elections office or organizations who can help.

DO NOT guess about the voter registration rules. When in doubt, call your Supervisor of Elections office or the 866-OUR-VOTE hotline.
