WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN MINNESOTA?

To vote in Minnesota, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen
- At least 18 years old on Election Day
- A resident of Minnesota for at least 20 days
- Not currently incarcerated for a felony conviction
- You can vote while under guardianship unless a judge specifically has revoked your right to vote.
- You cannot vote if a court has ruled that you are legally incompetent.

You may also pre-register to vote at 16 or 17 years old.

However, you still must be 18 years old to vote.



HOW CAN I VOTE?

In person on Election Day

- **Date:** Nov. 7, 2023
- **Hours:** 7 a.m. – 8 p.m. (Please note: During smaller election years these hours may vary. Check your polling place hours at sos.state.mn.us)

Early by mail

- You can apply to have an absentee ballot sent to you by visiting sos.state.mn.us

Early in person

- Absentee voting locations are open during normal business hours starting 46 days before Election Day.

Agent Delivery

- In special circumstances, you can qualify for agent delivery. You can learn more at the sos.state.mn.us

WHO IS ON THE BALLOT?

IN 2023, MINNESOTA IS HAVING COUNTY, SCHOOL DISTRICT, & MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

IN HENNEPIN COUNTY:

- City Council

IN RAMSEY COUNTY:

- School boards
- Mayoral candidates



HOW DO THESE POSITIONS IMPACT YOUR LIFE?

Municipalities usually are responsible for:

- Parks and recreation services
- Housing services
- Emergency medical services
- Transportation services
- Municipal courts
- Public works
- Police & fire departments



Your city council & mayor will be making decisions on these issues that will affect your community.

School boards are responsible for:

- Establishing the vision/goals for public schools in the district.
- Setting the performance standards for schools and superintendents.
- Ensuring school districts are responsive to the values, beliefs and priorities of their communities.

WHAT'S NEW

IN MN ELECTIONS?

During the 2023 legislative session, Minnesota passed a number of electoral reforms:

Effective June 1, 2023:

- Pre-registration for 16- & 17-year-olds
- Restore the Vote
- True early voting & extended early voting

Effective July 1, 2023:

- Right to paid time off from work to vote
- Residential voting lists for students
- Voting facilitation for assisted living facility residents

Expected effective date of early 2024:

- Automatic Voter Registration

Effective Jan. 1, 2024:

- Voter language access resources

Effective June 1, 2024:

- Permanent absentee voting lists

Increased funding in fiscal years 2024 & 2025:

- Improved physical accessibility at polling places
