Nevadans can vote for a constitutional ballot initiative to establish a 7-person redistricting commission to draw U.S. House of Representative and legislative Assembly and Senate districts after the decennial census.

Fair Selection Process Seven Redistricting Commissioners



First four commissioners chosen by:

Senate Majority Leader Assembly Speaker
Senate Minority Leader Assembly Minority Leader



First four pick final three. None of final three can be members of the two largest parties.



- No lobbyists, elected officials, or candidates.
- No employees or consultants of officeholder or political action committee.
- No political party officials or state employees.
- No relatives of these categories.

Strict Rules for Drawing Election Districts

In priority order, required criteria include:

1. U.S. Constitution and federal law
2. Equal population
3. Contiguity
4. Minority voting rights
5. No undue advantage for one party
6. County, city, and township boundaries
7. Communities of interest
8. Compactness
9. Competitiveness

Nonpartisan Approval Required

- Five votes out of seven needed to approve a map.
- At least one Democratic vote, one Republican vote, and one independent/third party vote required.
