Dear Secretary Tillerson, Director Shaub, Inspector General Linick and Ms. McManus,

On April 4, 2017, U.S. Department of State's website ShareAmerica published an article entitled *Mar-a-Lago: The winter White House.*¹ A summary of this article, with a link to the full article, was published on the website of the U.S. Embassy in the United Kingdom² and was also reportedly circulated by the U.S. Embassy in Albania.³

The State Department article notes that President Trump owns Mar-a-Lago and operates it as a private club open to dues-paying members. The article describes the private club in glowing terms and explains that President's use of the club as a "winter White House" fulfills the dream of Mar-a-Lago's original owner, socialite and cereal heiress Marjorie Merriweather Post.

State Department use of resources to promote a private business owned by President Trump constitutes a misuse and abuse of taxpayer dollars. Federal regulation provides that "[a]n employee shall not use his public office ... for the endorsement of any product, service or enterprise[.]" 5 C.F.R. § 2635.702. This general prohibition on government employee endorsement of products, services or enterprises is repeated in subsection (c) of the regulation, with several exceptions that don't apply to the State Department's article promoting Mar-a-Lago. See 5 C.F.R. § 2635.702(c).

The Office of Government Ethics, which administers government ethics regulations generally, including this "endorsement" prohibition specifically, summarizes the prohibition as follows:

Subpart G contains four provisions designed to ensure that employee [sic] do not misuse their official positions. These include: A prohibition against employees using public office for their own private gain for the private gain of friends, relatives, or persons with whom they are affiliated in a non-Government capacity, or for the endorsement or any product, service, or enterprise[.]⁴

The State Department's publication of the article *Mar-a-Lago: The winter White House* on the ShareAmerica website, and promotion of the article by U.S. embassies clearly warrant investigation.

"It is the responsibility of the employing agency to initiate appropriate disciplinary or corrective action in individual cases[,]" and "corrective action may be ordered or disciplinary action recommended by the Director of the Office of Government Ethics under the procedures" set forth in at part 2638 of the Government Ethics code. 5 C.F.R. §§ 2635.106(b) and 2638.501-04.

Common Cause calls on the Department of State and Office of Government Ethics to conduct an investigation and to take disciplinary action to hold all responsible federal government employees accountable for this clear misuse and abuse of taxpayer funds.

A dream deferred

Mar-a-Lago was designated a National Historic Site in 1969 in recognition of its design and architecture. Three years later it was entered into the National Register of Historic Places, a list of sites the U.S. deems worthy of preservation.

But Post had even bigger plans for her Palm Beach home. Upon her death in 1973, she willed the estate to the U.S. government, intending it to be used as a winter White House for the U.S. president to entertain visiting foreign dignitaries.



That opened the way for Trump, a real-estate magnate, to purchase the property in 1985. When he acquired the house, Trump also bought the decorations and furnishings that Post had collected over the years, preserving Mar-a-Lago's style and taste.




After refurbishing the house and adding an events space, Trump opened the estate to dues-


